Mac os User Guide

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Introduction

Thank you for choosing DesktopText Dashboard Widget for Mac OS X. This guide will get you started and help you explore its functions and features.

Requirements

This program requires **Mac OS X 10.5** (Leopard) with **Safari** web browser installed. Furthermore, an Internet connection is required.

About the Mac OS X Dashboard

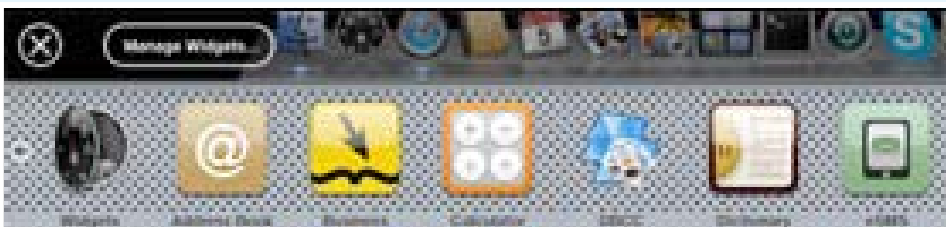
How to open the Dashboard

There are several ways to open up the Dashboard. By default, hitting the **F12** key on the keyboard (or F4 on Apple aluminium keyboards) will bring up the Dashboard. You can also click the Dashboard icon in the Dock, if available (see image below).



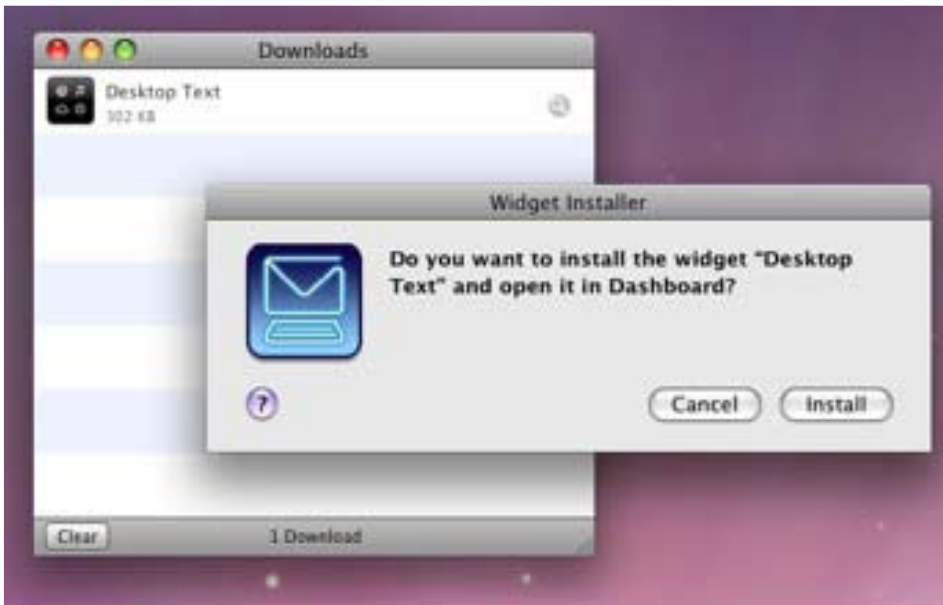
Adding and removing Widgets

When the Dashboard is activated, there is a plus-sign in the lower left corner of the screen. Click it to open up the Widgets Panel. Here you will find all available Widgets. Simply click the Widget you wish to add and you will see it appear on the Dashboard (see lower left image). To remove a Widget that has been placed on the Dashboard, click the **X** icon located in the upper left corner of each Widget (see lower right image).

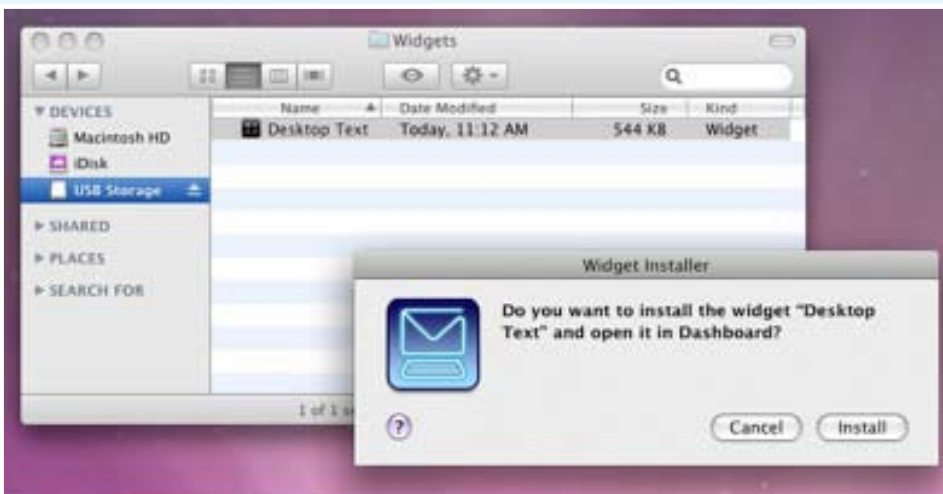


Installation

A Widget is usually downloaded in a compressed zip file format. After downloading it, the Widget installation might be launched automatically. If not, all you need to do is **double click** the zip file in the **Downloads** window to install it onto the Dashboard.



If you have obtained the Widget as a single file (USB storage device etc.), double click the Widget file to install it.



Launching the Widget

The first time you use a new Widget, it will be enclosed by a frame asking you if you want to keep or block it. Click on **Keep** if you want to use the Widget.

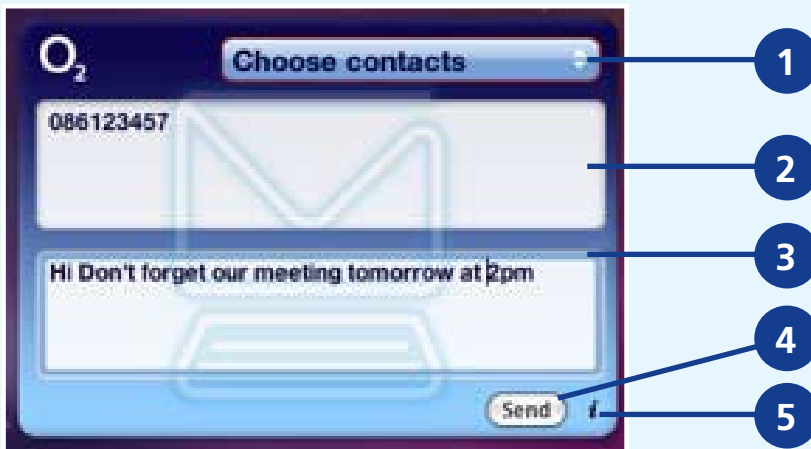


Registration

Before you can send SMS messages, you need to complete the **Registration Wizard**. The first time you start the DesktopText Widget, the Registration Wizard will appear automatically. In the first step, enter your mobile phone number and click **Next**. A registration code will now be sent to your mobile phone, so make sure to have it switched on. After a short while, a new text field will appear, in which you should enter the registration code that was just sent to your mobile phone. The DesktopText Widget will now validate the registration code and display a success message if the code was correct. Click **OK** to close the Registration Wizard and start sending messages.

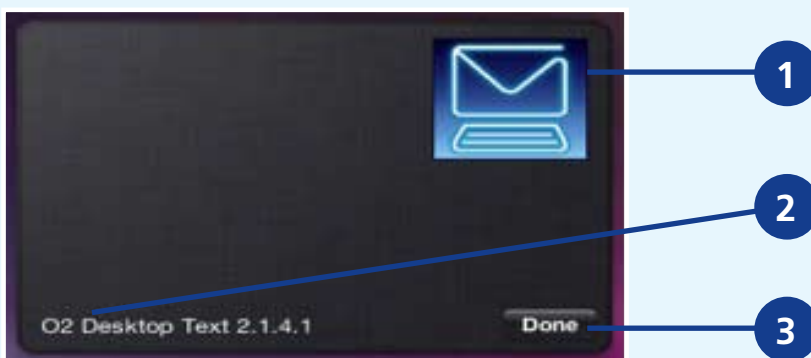
The user interface

Frontside



1. **Contact list** – Contains your Mac Address Book contacts. Choose a contact to add his/her number to the recipient field
2. **Recipient field** – Enter the mobile phone number to which you want to send a message. You can add recipients manually or by choosing from the Contact list. You can add multiple recipients by separating them with a comma
3. **Message field** – Enter the message text you want to send. You can enter up to 160 characters
4. **Send button** – Click to send your message. You need to specify a message text and at least one recipient to send a message
5. **Info button** – Click this button to see the Widget backside, containing product and publisher information

Backside



1. **Logotype image** – showing the Desktop Text logo. Upon clicking this button, a web browser will launch, pointing to the O2 web site
2. **Info label** – Displays information about the Widget's version number
3. **Done button** – Closes the Widget backside and returns to the frontside



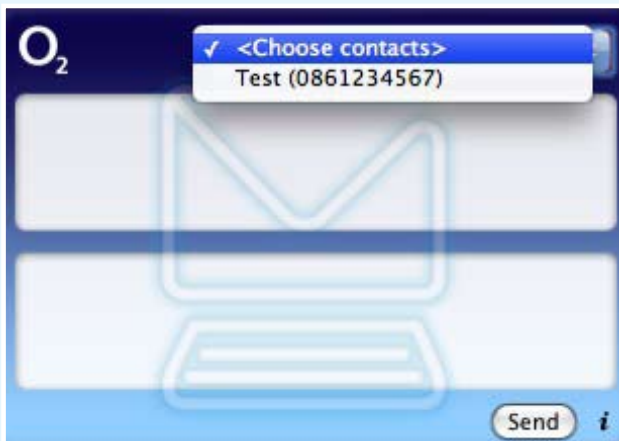
How to send an SMS message

Enter a recipient by typing his/her number in the **Recipient field**, or by choosing a contact in the **Contacts list** (see chapter “Contacts”). Then enter a message in the **Message field**. When you are ready to send the message, click the **Send button**.

Contacts

The Contact list

The DesktopText Widget integrates with your **Mac Address Book**. It will recognize the names which have a mobile phone number associated with them. It will ignore any entries lacking a mobile phone number. The Widget can also handle contacts which have multiple mobile phone numbers.



Refreshing the Contacts List

Every time you open up the Contact list in the DesktopText Widget, it will perform a quick synchronization with your Address Book, making sure that you always have an updated Contact list. Note that when you have added or changed a contact in the Address Book, you must quit the Address Book before the DesktopText Widget can update its Contact list with the latest changes.



Uninstall

To uninstall the DesktopText Widget, open up the Dashboard and the Widget Panel. Then, click **Manage Widgets...** This will bring up a list of all available Widgets, some of which having a red circular icon to their right. Click on the icon next to the DesktopText Widget to remove it.
